Warren Ackerman made a slick all-out running play on a sinking liner. Jeff Delnickas made an over-the-shoulder catch, and then a diving catch on a hard grounder over 2B. "Dirt Dog" Murray for a diving grab up the middle to start a DP. Alan Swiman at SF for two sparkling catches of liners. Duke for a couple of scoops on low throws to first.
